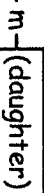
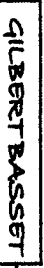
Robert d'Oilly died 1096 (no heirs) so village reverted to his brother Nigel

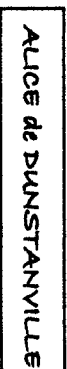

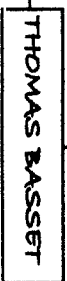


Robert granted village as marriage portion when daughter married Gilbert Bassett, member of the Honour of Wallingford

Had been Sheriff of Oxon 1163-4 and justice itinerant through several counties. Awarded titles and other land in recognition of war service

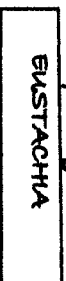

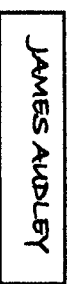

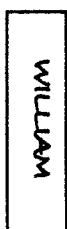
